



#### Dear Friends,

The words from today's Gospel, "repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God," are a reminder of our struggle to integrate our lives as faithful citizens with our lives as faithful Catholics. We are obligated to do both: to bring our faith and our values to all our responsibilities, including our civic ones. May the Eucharist we receive and share today strengthen us in fulfilling our mission in every respect.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Cyrus, the great Persian king, did not know God. But Isaiah maintains that God called him by name. The people of Thessalonica did not know Christ. But Paul asserts that the Holy Spirit brought him and the gospel to them. Jesus proposes that we should repay to God what belongs to God. Whether we are conscious of it or not, all we have been given—including our very life—comes ultimately from God. May God's word remind us that we too belong to God.

**STEWARDSHIP:** The steward accepts the Lord's call to live in faith, hope and love, to serve one another in His name. Christian discipleship begins with vocation, the call to follow Jesus and imitate His way of life. Jesus offers the grace and strength to live as His disciple and to practice stewardship.

**A REMINDER:** On Sunday at the 8am Mass at St. Augustine, we will be commissioning 3 students from St. Augustine and 5 students form St. Anthony preparing to receive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at their Confirmation on April 24, 2024, at St. Dominic. Let us keep them in our prayers as they proceed in their faith journey. At the 9:30am Mass at St. Anthony we will be installing 22 Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion. We thank them for their ministry among <u>us.</u>

**A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:** What can I do concretely to repay to God what belongs to God? How does giving back to God make me feel richer?
