

Dear Friends,

Today and next Sunday we celebrate the final Sundays of the liturgical year. The readings at this time of year traditionally focus on the last days: the time when this world will come to an end. Consequently, we hear of tribulations and horrors, of "a time unsurpassed in distress." We may scoff at such "The world is ending!" paranoia, but in the back of our minds we know that one day, one way or another, the earth will be no more. May our trust in a loving and merciful God console us.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: Today we hear two great examples of apocalyptic literature, a style of writing that prophesies about the end of the world. Both Daniel and Jesus hope to arouse a sense of urgency if not fear in their listeners. Phrases like "everlasting horror" and "stars . . . falling from the sky" will do that! Even as we hear the many foreboding visions, let us also listen for words of hope, trusting in a God whose generosity remains unsurpassed.

STEWARDSHIP: As a result of God's generosity and love for us, He sent His only Son, Jesus, to die for us. Jesus calls us his disciples, to a new way of life - the Christian way of life - of which stewardship is a part. Our stewardship should mirror God's generosity.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> Sunday at 9:30am Mass at St. Anthony, we will be hosting the Breese Knights of Columbus Council 2869 Memorial Mass, remembering twelve members who died this past Fraternal Year and whose combined years of Service to the Order is 633 years, averaging 52.75 years. May they rest from their labors, for their *Good Works* go before them.

<u>A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK:</u> How do I balance the vigilance I am called to exercise in anticipation of the end of the world with the comfort I take in God's merciful presence?

WHAT HAPPENS WITH ASSISTED SUICIDE?

A doctor prescribes lethal drugs that can be sent through the mail to a person wishing to end his or her life if diagnosed with a terminal illness. There is no requirement that a doctor or anyone be present with a person in case something would go wrong upon consumption of the drugs. The person may take hours to die. Assisted suicide is not dignified, it is deadly. Tell your state legislators: **Vote NO on SB 3499** - assisted suicide.
