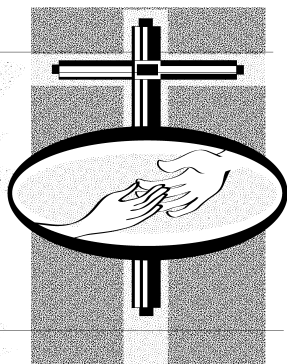

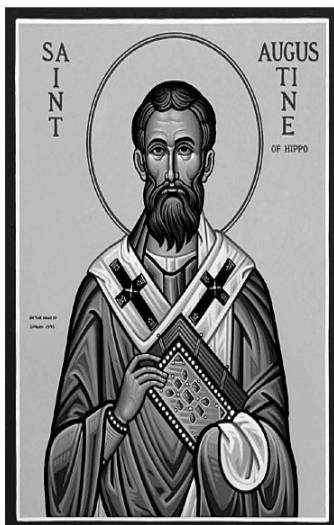

Dear Friends,

Three and a half weeks into this forty day journey through Lent, we may have become lost. Perhaps we have returned to our normal habits, chafing under the disciplines of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. Perhaps we've slipped and found ourselves rationalizing our failures. The story of the prodigal son, which we hear today, reminds us that no matter what we have done or failed to do, God stands always ready to welcome us back. No matter how far we have strayed, rejoice! for we are never too far gone to return to God.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: On the plains of Jericho, the Chosen People finally reach a fertile land that can produce food for them to eat. Paul extols God's goodness, for God reconciled the world through Christ. In the Gospel story of the prodigal son, the father is so overjoyed at his wayward son's return that he throws a huge feast, serving the choicest food and insisting his son wear the household's finest clothes. From beginning to end, we can, as we sing in the responsorial psalm, "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord."

STEWARDSHIP: If we accept God's grace and repenting struggle to change, God will respond like the father of the Prodigal Son. "Filled with compassion" at seeing his repentant child approaching after a long and painful separation, this loving parent "ran to his son, embraced him and kissed him" even before the boy could stammer out the words of sorrow he had rehearsed (Lk 15:20). God's love is always there. The spirit of wisdom and courage helps us to seek pardon and to be mindful, in the face of all our forgetting, that the most important work of our lives is to be Jesus' disciples and His faithful stewards.

A REMINDER: This weekend the Eighth Graders preparing for Confirmation will be gathering for their Luke 18 Retreat experience – please keep them in your prayers. Have you attended the Adoration time on Tuesdays from Noon-1pm? – An awesome experience to spend an hour in meditation with the Lord. Stations of the Cross this Friday at 7pm in St. Anthony (no faith formation this week).

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How can I be merciful like the father in this parable? What resentments do I need to overcome? Can I be truly forgiving to someone who has hurt me or those I love?
