Dear Friends,

How appropriate it is to celebrate Mother's Day and Good Shepherd Sunday on the same day! Many of us are fortunate to have mothers who have cared for us, comforted us, and protected us, much as shepherds do for their flocks. A mother's love is an example of the Good Shepherd's love for each of us. Let us give thanks for all those who have mothered us and shepherded us throughout our lives.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: On Good Shepherd Sunday, we first hear Saints Paul and Barnabas shepherd both Jews and Gentiles who chose to join the early church, urging them to remain faithful to the grace of God. In the psalm, we proclaim that we too are sheep of the Lord's flock. In a vision, John sees the Lamb of God shepherding a great multitude to springs of life-giving water. Finally, Jesus tells us in the Gospel that he gives all his sheep eternal life and no one can take that away. May listening to God's word increase our faith in our Good Shepherd.

STEWARDSHIP: Jesus calls us, as his disciples, to a new way of life: the Christian way of life--of which stewardship is part. He does not call us as nameless people in a faceless crowd. He calls us individually by name. Each one of us -- clergy, religious, lay person; married, single; adult, child has a personal vocation. God intends each one of us to play a unique role in carrying out the divine plan. The challenge, then, is to understand our role--our vocation and to respond generously to this call from God. Christian vocation entails the practice of stewardship. In addition, Christ calls each of us to be stewards of our personal vocations, which we receive from God.

<u>A REMINDER:</u> On this Mother's Day weekend we ask God's blessings upon all Mothers and through the intercession of Mary, our Spiritual Mother, that they may always know our appreciation and gratitude for the gift of life which they gave us.

A QUESTION FOR THE WEEK: How has my mother (or mother figure) been a good shepherd for me? Make sure to thank her to-day.
