

Dear Friends,

In the days and weeks that followed the Resurrection, the Risen Lord kept appearing to his disciples when and where they least expected: in a locked room in Jerusalem, on the road to Emmaus, on the shore of the Sea of Tiberias. Each time, it took a while for them to recognize him. We often fail to recognize him as well, even though we know he continues to appear in our midst today. Whether in the person in need, in God's word, in the Eucharist, or in each other, let us be reminded that he continues to offer his presence to us every day.

THIS WEEK'S SCRIPTURE LESSON: In the first reading, Saint Peter courageously faces down the Sanhedrin when they try to forbid the disciples from preaching and teaching in Jesus' name. The Gospel reveals that Jesus himself gave Peter that courage by leading him to profess his love for him three times, as he had lacked that courage when denying Jesus three times. May we realize that Jesus constantly invites us to reconciliation as well, instilling in us the courage to spread the Good News.

STEWARDSHIP: Jesus personally calls Simon Peter to "feed my lambs." We also are called to be disciples of Jesus. Each of us must discern, accept, and live out joyfully and generously the commitments, responsibilities and roles to which God calls us individually. Christian Stewards respond in a particular way to the call to be Jesus' disciples. The Steward is grateful for the gifts he or she has received and is eager to use them to show love for God and for one another.

<u>A REMINDER</u>: We rejoice this weekend with the First Holy Communion of 4 children from St. Augustine and 5 children from St. Anthony, please keep them and their families in your prayers. And we look forward to the Confirmation of 6 young adults from St. Augustine and 7 young adults from St. Anthony who will receive the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Wednesday, May 7th, at 7pm in St. Dominic Church. A Let us also keep them and their families in our prayers.
